Dinner money

I apologise for moaning again about this issue. However, the collecting of dinner money continues to be a big problem for us regarding Year 3, 4, 5 and 6. We spend so long chasing Parents for money. This is not our job, it should be paid in advance or Parents should send in a packed lunch. We phone, send texts and letters; this is at a cost to our school. Herts Catering is a separate company to Oughton.

To be blunt, you can not visit a restaurant, eat and not pay your bill for a few weeks or longer.

We DO NOT have money in our school budget to pay outstanding bills to Herts Catering.

Please pay in advance.

Attendance

We continue to monitor our attendance closely. Well done to Pear class who were the top class for attendance for the second half of the Spring term. They receive their class certificate and extra play.

Please remember, if your child's attendance drops below 90%, we will require medical evidence such as medication, appointment cards etc. in order to authorise their attendance. We still continue to have many children below 90%.

Just a reminder we do not authorise any holidays or days away during school time, unless it is exceptional circumstances. **Our school target is 96% for each child.**

- 95% = 8 days missed in education or 1 week and 3 days, approximately 47 lessons.
- 90% = 16 days missed in education or 3 weeks and 1 day, approximately 95 lessons
- 85% = 24 days missed in education or 4 weeks and 4 days, approximately 142 lessons
- 80% = 32 days missed in education or 6 weeks and 2 days, approximately 190 lessons

We do have a significant number of children who have an attendance of 90% or below. This greatly impacts on their learning and the gap between others can widen. This month we have been looking at the progress of each child in reading, writing, maths and science and it is very evident that poor attendance is impacting on progress.

If you child arrives late each day i.e. after 9:15am, they will have missed a lesson. Our learning starts at 9am and our classes focus on reading at this time. This life skill is vital so **please ensure your child is in their class by 9am.** Our office staff have other work to do and late children are impacting on other important work.
