Dear Parents and Carers,

Nuts

We have a number of children in school with nut allergies, some with severe and potentially life threatening consequences. Please ensure that your child does not bring any products into school which contain nuts. This includes all packed lunches - Nutella in sandwiches, nuts of any kind, cakes with nuts. If you are making cakes for any sales in school, please ensure that there are no nuts used e.g. crunchy nut cornflakes. Thank you, this is a very serious situation and we need to ensure that all children are safe and healthy in school. Also, please do not put chocolate bars or sweets in packed lunches - a chocolate biscuit is acceptable.

Attendance

Regular attendance is vital in order for children to learn. We expect attendance to be 96% or higher. We are spending a lot of time contacting Parents regarding children who are not in school - phoning and visiting homes. It is your responsibility to inform us of the reason that your child is not in school, as it is a legal requirement for children to attend. Please make sure you ring us between 8:30-9:30am or contact us via email: attendance@oughton.herts.sch.uk. We have extended our facility within ParentMail - you may now inform us of your child's absence through ParentMail, following the absence link. Please ensure that you add in the reason for the illness in the additional information box in order for us to look at the authorisation of the absence. We must have written reasons emails / letters following a period of absence, please ensure that you send in a letter, email or add detail into ParentMail. We are also spending a lot of office time chasing up written notes. Thank you to those Parents who always follow absences up in writing. Please note, holidays are not authorised. We issue penalty fines within school regarding unauthorised absences, so if your child has more than 15 unauthorised sessions (morning / afternoon is 2 sessions) you may be subject to a fine. Please be aware that this term, if your child's attendance drops below 90%, we will require medical evidence (medicines, doctor's note, evidence of visits to doctor / hospital) in order to authorise absences.
