MATHS

I have attached a sheet of Maths problems that you can try at home. Don't worry if these are tricky, try your best and we can go through them when we get back to school. Remember, it is important to continue to practise your Maths so if you complete the problems quickly or find them very hard, have a go at Mathletics or Times Table Rock stars.

Maths Practical:

Your job this week is to write a short paragraph about an activity that includes Maths. I would suggest you could help with the cooking one night and write about all the ways you used Maths! However, there are many other good activities.

If you are helping with the cooking there are many mathematical things you could write about:

- The weight of the ingredients
- The time needed to cook them
- How you could divide the food between your family members (fractions!)

Do not panic about how to record this information, you could use bullet points to record each mathematical step or write it as a full paragraph. However, if you have another way this will be great too!

Remember to use Mathletics too! You should have received the login via parentmail.

Your task for this week is to research what happened on VE day and why it is important to our country. You could write a short sentence about this or create a poster. In addition, I have attached some extra information about VE day to help you with your research!</p>	<p><u>PE</u> This week in PE I would like you to create a work out timetable. This could include activities from Joe Wicks, sports or any other physical activity. I would suggest having 7 daily slots and trying to work for 20 mins a day. This could be 7 different activities, one each day, or a series of activities each day like Joe Wicks! <u>Try and keep active for at least 30 minutes a day!</u></p>
<p><u>RE</u> This week you have an RE challenge. I would like you to find out as much as you can about the differences between the Protestant Church of England and the Roman Catholic Church. I would suggest you try and find 3 main ways in which they are different.
