MATHS

This week in Maths we will be practising the main written methods for addition and subtraction. I have included a worksheet for you to do and examples of each method. However, remember you can also access Oughton's calculation policy via our website, which will help you to follow the written methods.

Maths Practical:

Your job this week is to write a short paragraph about an activity that includes Maths. Last week I suggested time so this week try and write about measure.

There are many things you could write about but here are some ideas:

- How far you travel on a walk or bike ride
- How tall member of your household are
- Measuring things like the length of garden or how much you weigh

Do not panic about how to record this information, you could use bullet points to record each mathematical step or write it as a full paragraph. However, if you have another way this will be great too!

<p><u>D&T</u> One of the summer D&T topics for year 5 was to design a toy with a moving part. As a result, your challenge this week is to design your own toy.
