

Year 5 home learning – week 9

WRITING

Your challenge this week is to begin a magical adventure story. I have included a short extract from a book and we are going to use this as inspiration for our own ideas. I have produced a model based on the extract that sticks quite closely to it. However, feel free to use your own ideas.

In my story, a girl, who has a witch as a mother, must take a potion to the king, who has fallen ill. In the first chapter that we will be writing, the girl is introduced as she returns home. I have focused on description and the use of relative clauses this week, I would like you to do the same.

MATHS

This week in Maths, we will be applying our understanding of fraction problems. Remember, to find a fraction of a number divide by the denominator (bottom number) and multiply by the numerator (top number). For example:

Erica has 100 sweets and ate $\frac{2}{5}$ of the in a week. However, James has 66 sweets and ate $\frac{1}{3}$ of them. James says that he ate more sweets, is he correct?

To solve this, you must work out how many sweets each person ate. To find out Erica's number, I must divide 100 by 5 (as 5 is the denominator) and then multiply the answer by 2 (because 2 is the numerator). So 100 divided by 5 is 20, and 20 multiplied by 2 is 40, so Erica ate 40 sweets.

To find the answer for James, I divide 66 by 3 (because 3 is the denominator) which is 22. Then, I need to multiply it by 1 (as 1 is the numerator) so my answer remains at 22.

As a result the answer to my problem is that Erica ate more sweets because she ate 40 and James only ate 22.
